ARTICLE I

Richardi Park Regulations

[Adopted 12-3-1992 by Ord. No. 27-1992]

§ 75-1. Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation of this article:

ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR — Any spirituous, vinous, malt or fermented liquor, liquids and compounds, whether or not medicated, proprietary, patented and by whatever name called, containing 1/2 of 1% or more of alcohol by volume which are fit for use for beverage purposes, and include but are not limited to beer, wine, distilled alcoholic beverages and brandy.

BICYCLE — A device on which a person may ride, which is propelled by human power, and which has either two or three wheels in a tandem or tricycle arrangement which are more than 14 inches in diameter.

MOTOR VEHICLE — Every vehicle which is self-propelled and every vehicle which is propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated upon rails.

PET — any domesticated animal, including but not limited to dogs, cats, snakes, mice, rats, gerbils, hamsters and horses. A pet shall not include a seeing-eye or hearing-aid dog while assisting a blind or hearing-impaired person.

RICHARDI PARK — The following property located in the Village of Bellaire, State of Michigan and described as: Commencing on the east side of N. Bridge Street 58.6 feet south of the S 1/8 line; thence east to Intermediate River; thence northerly along the river to the extended south line of Lot 8, Block "C," Hastings Addition to the Village of Bellaire; thence west to a point due south of the southeast corner of Lot 14, Block "C," Richardi and Bechtold's Addition to said Village; thence north to the south line of Antrim Street; thence west to the east line of N. Bridge Street; thence southerly to the point of

beginning.

VEHICLE — Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, excepting devices exclusively moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks and excepting a mobile home as defined in Section 2 of Act No. 419 of the Public Acts of 1976, as amended, being Section 125.1102 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

§ 75-2. Prohibited conduct.

No person within Richardi Park shall:

- A. Possess or consume alcoholic liquor.
- B. Take a pet into or permit a pet to enter that portion of the park enclosed by the park fence, including the swimming beach area.
- C. Take a bicycle into that portion of the park enclosed by the park fence.
- D. Park a motor vehicle in that portion of the park enclosed by the park fence; provided, however, that temporary parking of a motor vehicle within the area enclosed by the park fence is permitted in association with an event taking place in Richardi Park where the motor vehicle is necessary to transport items to or from the event and where the event has been approved by the Village or its designated representative.
- E. Be within Richardi Park after 10:00 p.m. [Added 6-1-1995]

§ 75-3. Penalties.¹

- A. Municipal civil infractions; penalties. Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction as defined in Public Act 12 of 1994, amending Public Act 236 of 1961, being Sections 600.101 to 600.9939 of Michigan Compiled Laws, and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$500. Each day this article is violated shall be considered as a separate violation.
- B. Enforcement officials. Officers of the Bellaire Police Department, and other Village officials designated by resolution of the Village Council, are hereby authorized to issue municipal civil infractions under this article directing offenders to appear in court.
- C. Nuisance per se. A violation of this article is hereby declared to be a nuisance per se and is declared to be offensive to the public health, safety and welfare.
- D. Civil remedies. In addition to enforcing this article through the use of a municipal civil infraction proceeding, the Village may initiate proceedings in the Circuit Court to abate or eliminate the nuisance per se or any other violation of this article.
